## Army illegally...

illegal occupation of Army at Gulmarg, in lieu of the land to be exchanged for Tattoo Ground Batamaloo.

## Omar admits...

power projects by NHPC to the State but NHPC has adopted a rigid approach," he said.

Asserting that they left no stone unturned in the process, Omar said no new power project will be given to NHPC. "They (NHPC) has stuck to its stand, as such we have decided not to handover any project to the Corporation in future," he said.

"This is our brave decision and we will stick to it," he said and added that Dulhasti-II and Uri-II power projects allotted to NHPC earlier have been got back and now declared as joint projects.

On power generation, the Chief Minister said that as against the indigenous generation of 750 MW established in the State since 1947, his government had allotted power projects of 1,500 MW in just five years since 2009.

He said more projects with capacity of 1,000 MW are being allotted by the end of this year and "a strong edifice" has been laid to generate 9,000 MW power in the State in the next seven to eight years.

## ON SECURITY SITUATION:

Jammu and Kashmir has witnessed a 71 per cent drop in militancy in the five years of the National Conference-led government in the State, Abdullah told the Upper House.

"Militancy has declined by 71 per cent in the last five years... No collateral damage has occurred in the anti-militancy operations by security forces," Omar said.

The Chief Minister claimed there has been a significant improvement in the security scenario while human rights violations have come down to almost zero.

Lauding security forces for showing restraint in challenging situations, Omar referred to the militant attacks on an Army convoy and on BSF at Bemina and said that these incidents were examples of troops not resorting to indiscriminate firing to save the lives of innocent civilians.

Meanwhile, although Omar praised the Army for instituting an inquiry into the Machil fake encounter, he expressed dismay over its decision to close the Pathribal fake encounter probe.

"When it is established that innocent civilians have been killed, it is necessary to identify the culprits, he said, adding, "If the culprits are not those towards whom fingers are being pointed, then we have to find out who the real offenders are."

He said he had taken up the matter with Prime Minister. He, meanwhile, gave full credit to the people of JK for the gradual return of peace in the State.

He said that sustained efforts by the government, aided by the wholehearted support and commitment of the people, had yielded fruit.

"Conspiracies were hatched to disturb the law and order situation in the State and create hurdles in the delivery of governance, but the people of JK defeated those behind such attempts," he said.

Omar referred to the Kishitwar, Budgam, Zanskar and other incidents fanned to create communal clashes in the State and disturb peace.

He vehemently rejected the false conception being sold "by a group of people" dubbing the prevailing peaceful situation in the State as deceptive and by force. "They want to carry the false propaganda as if the government has filled jails and pressurized the people to remain peaceful", he said.

The Chief Minister said that people of the State are eager to see peace rooting fast and development reaching every nook and corner of the State, as such, they contribute positively in creating peace conditions and strengthening the efforts and initiatives of the government in this direction.

Omar Abdullah said that no jails have been filled with people and nobody is under pressure to work for normalcy. "It is the desire and the will of the people to live in peace and create conducive atmosphere", he said maintaining that only 2396 persons who are mostly criminals are in prisons in the State and of these 35 have been arrested under Public Safety Act (PSA).

## READY WITH REPORT CARD:

The Chief Minister said that his government would go back to people with its report card of last five years and will seek people's mandate.

"The recent decision of my government regarding the creation of New Administrative Units in the State was not only historic but the cherished desire of the people", he said adding that his government is receiving appreciation for this decision all across the State.

"People from Kashmir, Jammu, Leh and Kargil are equally appreciating the government for this historic decision", he said and added that besides this achievement the coalition government has in its basket the thousands of other major works it has initiated, implemented and completed during the last five years.

"We are going to people with our report card and ask them to judge us on our performance and delivery", he said who do not believe in propaganda but in actions.

Underscoring the need for consultations with the Registrars of University of Kashmir and Jammu, the Board has submitted that the registration of the students who may be admitted against the vacant seats by Universities may also pose a problem for the students themselves.

The Board has convened a meeting with the stake holders on February 23 to discuss pros and cons of the issue.

On February 6, a Division Bench of High Court comprising Justice Hasnain Massodi and Justice Ali Muhammad Magrey had made it clear that nobody could be allowed to reap the fruits of the fraud and those who secured the admission in a professional college through deceitful and fraudulent means were to be de-seated to pave way to students who were deprived of fruits of their labour. The court had said in case the Board officers could not appreciate the urgency involved and steps required to be taken in the given circumstances, the right course for the officers was to step aside and allow those having commitment and requisite skill to man the posts held by them.

## Where is VK Singh...

Storming into the Well, Rashid said Government had "no guts" to summon Singh over his allegation that ministers in J&K are on the pay-rolls of Army since 1947.

"They (Legislators) called me an agent of intelligence agencies but he (Singh) has cleared who is the agent and who received money," he said, "It has been proven beyond any doubt that the ministers in J&K are gulping money on the name of ensuring peace."

Though Deputy Speaker Sartaj Madni repeatedly warned Rashid to return to his seat he did not pacify and continued with his protests in the Well. "Tell me first when you will summon VK Singh to the House. I want the answer," Rashid said repeatedly.

"The privilege committee is seized with the matter and it can't meet till Assembly is in session. The issue is alive but the committee will meet only after the assembly concludes and it will take a decision on future course of action," Madni told Rashid. "Now go to your seat and don't disturb the proceeding."

"Why should I go? I want an answer to my question when will you summon VK Singh," Rashid countered as he staged walkout from the House.

## NC, Cong in...

Naeem Akther Andrabi, Monday alleged that the present dispensation has even misused the office of Governor to "befool people and make false commitments."

"National Conference and Congress came in power by making lot of promises with people. The NC pledged Autonomy to the State, constitute Truth and Reconciliation Commission, taking back power projects from NHPC. However, even when the government term is nearing end nothing was done on these fronts," Akhter said in LC, participating in discussion on Governor's address.

He said that the people running the government were more interested in "savouring chairs than the State. "What happened to the Hill Development Council promise made with the people of Chenab Valley and Pir Panchal", he questioned.

"People have lost faith in the political system as the politicians have degraded themselves," he said adding, "Many say that collusion governments are 'marriage of convenience' for the people's welfare but the present regime in Jammu and Kashmir is only a 'live-in relationship' to fulfill own desires, without holding any responsibility," he said.

Akther, who is also the chief spokesperson of PDP, said the present regime is reluctant to accept their flaws and beats the drum of new administrative units, which is testimony that the government has no other achievements in last 5 years to highlight.

He accused the government of misusing the office of Governor to make false promises to the people. "Governor N N Vohra must be a relieved person as he is the man of detail, integrity and commands high respect, but the present government has been excessively making wrong statements in the address which have been delivered by Vohra during the last six years," he said. Elaborating, he said, "In 2012 the government, in the Governor's address, made a commitment to hold the elections of Block Development Council, District Development Board and Urban Local Bodies by setting deadline of April 2012", adding that the Governor was forced to make this false commitment and now the same government during this joint session has made the same commitments.

He said in 2012, in para VIII of the Governor's address the government stated that there was a special task force recommendation for making a one-time allocation in the plan for the development of Jammu and Ladakh regions. "In spite of saying that it was a one-time arrangement, in the current year's address also you have kept an allocation on that, negating what the Governor said in 2012," Akhter said, adding, "Incidentally this year also the issue has been dealt in para VIII."

"I have worked with the Governor and I know that he is very particular about his work and checks every file personally before arriving on any decision. But this government tried to hide their misdeeds and failures by stepping on the shoulder of an honest man," he said.

Akhter further claimed that even during the joint address this session the Governor opened up his speech by praising the government for creation of new administrative units. "This was done despite the fact that there has been no decision taken in this regard as of now," he said.

He said the country is going through a crisis: the crisis of confidence in the political and administrative systems. One of the prime reasons, he said, is that the political parties generally fail to honor their commitments and pledges. "Pledge, has a dictionary meaning, which he quoted, is 'solemn promise, undertaking, oath.'"

## Cabinet approves...

If sources are to be believed, Horticulture Minister Raman Bhalla had been looking ahead to get the department separated from Agriculture department, the portfolio of which is with Ghulam Hassan Mir.

"It is very surprising that the two departments, which are interconnected with each other, have been bifurcated without looking into the other aspects," they said, adding that single administrative department was adequately catering to the need and requirement of both the departments.

There is one administrative department for many ministries in the State and segregation has been done only in cases of urgent requirement or volume of work, sources said, adding, "There is only one administrative department for Health and Medical Education. Similar is the case with Housing and Urban Development despite the fact that Nawang Rigin Jora holds the portfolio of Urban Development and Raman Bhalla Housing."

## Ruckus in LA...

road accidents," shouted Targami, as members from PDP and BJP came on the front row and thumped the benches in protest against the government.

The PDP members led by party President Mehbooba Mufti said while the frequency of the road accidents has gone up in the State, resulting in death of innocent people, the Government was neither trying to find out the reason behind the growing rate of accidents nor has it put in place any mechanism to bring them down. "In absence of the government vigil the accidents have become a norm. Why are these accidents taking place at such a fast rate? Why is Government silent? Who is responsible for the loss of innocent lives?" Mehbooba asked. He said the House Committee constituted by the government under his chairmanship in 2012 has submitted its report to the government.

"What happened to the report? Why was it shelved?" Targami asked. Responding to the queries, the Speaker informed the House that the report was under his examination. "I will soon call a meeting to discuss its implementation," said the Speaker.

However the agitating members continued with their protest till the question hour ended. Later Sajad Kichloo made a statement on the accident in the House.

## Coalition strong, old...

He said coalition government worked in close coordination and there has never been any variance on issues in the Cabinet meetings nor any Cabinet member boycotted the meeting 'as was the routine in the opposition (PDP) led coalition government.'

He said coalition government held about 30 Cabinet meetings in each year during the last five years and came up with hundreds of decisions relating to the all round development of the State and the welfare of the people. The Chief Minister criticized the opposition for talking high and loud about the institutions and democratic methods but itself indulging in tarnishing the values of democracy and democratic institutions. "Those who talk of institutions and democracy are seen disrupting Governor's address, breaking furniture in the House and riding on tables in the Well of the House," he said. He lauded the Upper House for conducting the discussion on Governor's address in a conducive and palatable environment and highlighting the issues of public interest.

Abdullah said that instead of raising public issues in a democratic and peaceful manner, when legislators indulge in breaking furniture and disrupting proceedings of the House, they are degrading the dignity of Legislature and disappointing people who have voted them for battling for the welfare and development of the people and the State.

"How can you give lessons on democracy and institutions to others when you yourself indulge in the practice of defaming these," he questioned the opposition, without naming PDP.

## Rs 830 cr slashed...

Harsdev Singh targeted the Government for delaying the release of funds as recommended by the STFs and cutting down the funds under Bad Pockets category.

Singh said the Task Forces had recommended that Rs 915 crore should be disbursed to the regions in three years. But, he said, four years have gone by and only Rs 690 crores has been disbursed by the Government.

"The delay has hit the development plans and defeated the purpose for which the Task Forces were set up," Singh said.

In response to another question, the Minister said under the Bad Pocket category Rs 44 crores have been allocated to seven districts of Jammu division and two districts of mountainous Ladakh division during last two years.

In Kashmir, only two districts, Kupwara and Bandipora, have been covered under the Bad Pocket category and allocated Rs 11.20 crore during the past two years.

However the Minister said Rs 63 crore were allocated to Srinagar and Baramulla districts under the Special Area Development Program (SADP). However the reply did not mention the funds received by other districts including those from Jammu under the SADP.

## HC seeks copy...

as Jammu and Kashmir Control of Building Operations Act 1988 had been violated in the construction of various buildings in Srinagar, the High Court had ordered sealing of 42 illegal structures in the city.

Subsequently, the court was informed by the government that there were more than 4000 violations of Srinagar master plan.

On November 21, the court directed the J&K's Special Tribunal to consider the statutory appeals against the Srinagar Municipal Corporation's demolition orders on day-to-day basis and decide the same in accordance with the law.

The State Cabinet, however, on Sunday cleared the 'Civic Laws (Special Provisions) Bill-2014' to pave the way for putting a one-year moratorium on sealing and demolition of buildings that have come up in violation of master plan. The Bill would now go to the State Legislature for passage during the ongoing session.

The Bill puts one-year freeze on sealing of illegal structures in Srinagar, Jammu and Katra towns till March 2015. Besides, it mandates the government to formulate a policy till March 2015 for dealing with and regulating such unauthorized buildings.

According to sources, the government is mulling to revise the master plan of these places and change the land use to legalize the violations.

## JK Govt to...

The government maintained that Centre has agreed to allocate food grains to left-out population of the State at Above Poverty Line (APL) rates.

Speaking in the House, Minister of State for Consumer Affairs & Public Distribution (CAPD), Viqar Rasool, said the government has set the process of implementing NFSA in motion.

He said the government is carrying out the basic survey through field agencies for implementing the scheme.

"To ensure the timely implementation of NFSA 2014 in the State of J&K within the stipulated time and provide the ration as per 2011 census, the Consumer Affairs & Public Distribution Department has taken various preparatory steps and circulated a proforma among the general public of the State through field functionaries for obtaining basic inputs and for finalizing the basic survey of the households with respect to socio-economic status in order to arrive at reasonable criteria for inclusion /exclusion of households to be covered under NFSA," the Minister informed the House.

The Minister said JK's 74 lakh population would be covered under the scheme.

"Based on the National Sample Survey Organization (NSSO) data, the coverage determined by the Planning Commission has been calculated as 63.55 percent for rural areas and 47.10 percent for urban areas of JK State, which works out to be 74.13 lakh," the Minister said.

The Minister said the huge uncovered population was a matter of worry for them, but "due to intervention of Congress High Command the Centre has agreed to provide ration for 40 lakh population at APL rates."

At present, the State government covers 99 lakh population as per the population of year 2000.

As the Minister was replying, GM Saroori of Congress castigated the government for failing to prove ration to masses in accordance with the population figures of 2011.

"Most of the ration depots in my constituency are empty. On one hand the government claims that Food Security Act will cover entire population but on other it is yet to complete the survey for implementing the law," Saroori said.

Saroori later staged walkout from the House. Soon opposition Peoples Democratic Party and Bharatiya Janta Party too cornered the government over "ration shortage."

"The shortage of ration has assumed alarming proportions but the government has completely failed in redressing the issue," PDP's Abdul Rehman Veeri said.

"It is unfortunate that 15 lakh souls in the State are without ration cards and people are running from pillar to post to get ration but to no avail. It is easy to get passport in the State but it is very difficult to obtain ration card," Veeri said.

Harsh Dev Singh of Panthers Party, Jugal Kishore of BJP and Chaman Lal Gupta too slammed the government over the issue.

Harshev said ration is supplied only on papers to the masses but in reality "ration depots are empty." "Even people are not getting 15 to 20 Kg of ration, not to talk of 30 to 35 kg per family," Harshev Singh said.

Chaman Lal Gupta, MLA Jammu West, accused the government of failing to implement its promise of providing 50 kg ration per family.

"Last year the government had assured in the House that they will raise the allocation from 30 and 35 Kg to 50 Kg but the assurance has proved a hoax," he said.

MLA Langate, Er Rashid, said there is acute shortage of ration across the State.

"People can wait for jobs but they cannot wait for ration," Rashid said, "I will gherao the house of CAPD Minister if the government fails to address the problem."

MLA Poonch Ejaz Jan accused CAPD of creating inordinate delay in dispatch of ration in his native district.

"People in the district are facing lot of inconvenience due to unnecessary delay in dispatch of ration," he said.

MY Targami of CPI (M) came down heavily on government for failing to mention about ration in the Budget speech. Targami asked the government to be cautious while implementing the law, saying, "The scheme is targeted one but not universal."

"We should look at pros and cons of the scheme and look whether the implementation of the Act would create shortage of food grains," he said.

In the meanwhile, the entire opposition resorted to sloganeering over the issue.

"Jo Sarkar Rashan Na Deh, Woh Sarkar Nikkamee Hai (the government which fails to provide ration is incompetent)," the opposition shouted.

The opposition legislators later staged walk-out from the House. This is for the first time during the ongoing session that entire opposition staged walkout on a common issue.
