

# Vincent's 'hero' led him to dark world of match-fixing

Wellington, July 2: Disgraced former New Zealand batsman Lou Vincent says he's "a good lad" whose participation in match fixing, for which he is banned from cricket for life, was like "being dragged into a thick spider web."

In an interview with the New Zealand Herald on Wednesday, Vincent said he doesn't want sympathy but hopes for understanding of how he succumbed to the temptation to fix matches. Vincent said he was motivated by greed when he first became involved in fixing while playing in the unsanctioned Indian Cricket League. He was approached by a bookmaker who offered him \$15,000 and the services of a prostitute to manipulate the

outcome of games. Vincent reported the approach to a fellow player who he trusted, but found that player was already a match fixer. "Being around this person who oozed self-confidence and self-esteem was uplifting," he was quoted as saying. "I went to this person's room, explained my situation, then he paused, looked up and said 'that's great, a good cover because now you're working for me and we're going to be fixing matches.' "Try saying no to that. He said the ICL was unsanctioned, like backyard cricket, exhibition stuff, so fixing was OK and he'd pay me \$50,000 per game."



Vincent variously refers to the player involved as "The Don" or "My Hero."

He said the player threatened him with a cricket bat when a fix failed because of his mistakes. Vincent said he renewed his arrangement with the player involved when he went on to play for Lancashire in English county cricket. He admits approaching his Lancashire teammate, England player Mal Loye and offering him money to fix matches. Loye refused and reported the approach to the England and Wales Cricket Board. On Tuesday the ECB banned Vincent for life from all

involvement in cricket after he pleaded guilty to 18 fixing charges relating to county matches. Vincent describes the intricate system under which payments for his services were made.

"One time I was given an address at an industrial site in Birmingham," he said.

"I went to a pre-instructed street number and knocked."

I heard a latch and then the door opened and I walk into a small laundry. An elderly Indian couple in their 60s or 70s welcomed me. I'd been rung to say pick out any 20 pound note, and text the barcode to a bookie. I passed it on to these guys to verify my entrance. They said 'there's your bag of cash' and off I went." AP

# Broad wants life ban for all match-fixers

London, July 2: England all-rounder Stuart Broad called for all those found guilty of match-fixing to be given the same lifetime ban as handed down to former New Zealand batsman Lou Vincent on Tuesday.

The punishment, which was confirmed by the England and Wales Cricket Board, stems from one-day matches that Vincent admitted he helped rig in English county cricket.

Broad's lone Test century, a superb innings of 169 against Pakistan at Lord's in 2010, was overshadowed by newspaper revelations that the Pakistani trio of then captain Salman Butt and pacemen Mohammad Asif and Mohammad Aamer were ready to take

part in the deliberate bowling of no-balls in that match in return for cash. All three were subsequently banned for a minimum of five years by the International Cricket Council.

However, Broad said if he had his way, the Pakistani trio would not have a hope of a return, insisting that in the light of their case there was no excuse for "naivety" when it came to the issue of corruption.

"There's no excuse now around awareness of match-fixing," Broad said Tuesday at a news conference in London organised by sponsors Investec ahead of the forthcoming England-India Test series. "We sit through the most boring of lectures saying 'watch

out for this' or 'watch out for that,' helplines and all that sort of thing. "We have to do it through the ICC protocol," the 28-year-old Nottinghamshire paceman explained. "We do it before every World Cup and any new player who comes into the side gets called into an anti-corruption meeting."

"There's no excuse for naivety any more so I don't really see why it wouldn't be a flat out life ban," added Broad, the son of former England opener turned ICC match referee Chris Broad. "That would scare a lot of people out of it, I'd hope." "A five-year ban, a 10-year ban? I'd pretty much make it a flat-out lifetime ban if I was in control. But I'm not." AFP

# Islamia College Volleyball Tourny ICS Reds, ICS Whites to clash in finals today

Srinagar, July 2: In the ongoing inter-group Volleyball tournament organized by the Islamia College of Science & Commerce, semifinals were played at the college courts, here, on Wednesday.

In the first semi-final match ICS Reds defeated ICS Greens 2 sets 0 with the scores 25:21 and 25:11. In the second semi-final, ICS Whites defeated ICS Blues in a close contest. ICS Whites won the match 2 sets to 1 with the scores of 15:25, 25:10 and 25:21. On Thursday the final match of the event will be played between ICS Reds and ICS Whites. The tournament is being organized by the Physical Education Department of the Islamia College of Science & Commerce.



# Bouchard storms into maiden Wimbledon semifinal

London, July 2: Canada's Eugenie Bouchard reached her first Wimbledon semifinal and ensured a move into the world top 10 by beating Germany's Angelique Kerber 6-3, 6-4 on Wednesday.

Victory also meant that the 20-year-old has reached the last-four of all three Grand Slams in 2014. The blonde Canadian 13th seed had already defeated the ninth-seeded Kerber at the French Open last month.

And she was rarely threatened on Wednesday on Court One where Kerber, a semifinalist in 2012, was still feeling the effects of her marathon fourth round win over Maria Sharapova 24 hours earlier.

Bouchard, who will rise to number eight in the world next week to equal the record high ranking achieved by a Canadian, will face third seed Simona Halep on Thursday for a place in the final.

"It was definitely a tough battle, I've played her a few times and it's always been tough, so I knew it wasn't over. "I tried to keep fighting and thankfully I did it in the end," said Bouchard.

Meanwhile, Romania's Simona Halep swept into her first Wimbledon semifinal with a crushing 6-4, 6-0 victory over former finalist Sabine Lisicki on Wednesday.

Halep recorded her 250th

career win in memorable fashion as the world number three dismissed German 19th seed Lisicki, beaten by Marion Bartoli in the final 12 months ago, in just 57 minutes on Centre Court.

The 22-year-old reached her maiden Grand Slam final at the French Open last month and, after winning 11 consecutive games to sink Lisicki, she will play Canada's Eugenie Bouchard for a place in the another major final at the All England Club.

"I played my best today and I was enjoying every moment. It was incredible to be on Centre Court. It was just my second time," Halep said. AFP
